VATICAN CITY (CNS) -- After members of the Synod of Bishops approved their final document, Pope Francis announced that he would not write the customary post-synodal apostolic exhortation but would offer the final document to the entire church to implement.

"There are already highly concrete indications in the document that can be a guide for the mission of the churches in the different continents and contexts," he told synod members late Oct. 26. "For that reason, I do not intend to publish an apostolic exhortation. What we have approved is enough," he said. To read more, please click here
