### November 13<sup>th</sup> is the Feast Day of St. Frances Xavier Cabrini

Mother Cabrini's pioneering spirit was manifested early on, even before she founded the Missionary Sisters, as she grew in discernment, courage and energy, her capacity for relationship, and her drive and tenacity. She learned early in her life how to deal with setbacks, blocks, and frustrations: a gift she had learned from her deep and intimate prayer life and her loving relationship with the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

She was a very passionate woman – passionate to help others, passionate in overcoming the difficulties which were always assailing her, passionate in deepening a

gospel spirituality not only in her sisters but also in those to whom she and her sisters were ministering. Through the years, Mother Cabrini had become expert at handling difficulties and adversities, always maintaining her peace and always alert to the needs of others, especially the poor, the marginalized, the immigrant. She had a far-sighted vision of mission and had planted her Institute in eight countries by the time she died.

What was her secret? Where did all this energy and insight come from? From an early age, Frances knew how to immerse herself in the depths of the Heart of Jesus and scripture. She took every problem she had to the Heart of Jesus who inevitably showed her his love for her, how to resolve difficulties, what he wanted from her and what her priorities had to be.

We are so blessed to have these intimate glimpses into her heart and soul, her passion

and energy, her love and zeal. She was truly a "contemplative missionary" and she encouraged all of her sisters to be the same. Today, that is the same challenge that is offered to ever MSC, every Cabrini Lay Missionary (CLM), every Cabrinian collaborator and friend who is called to serve the Lord with compassion and zeal, determination and far sightedness.

What a blessing it is for us in the Cabrini Family in the 21<sup>st</sup> century to have a such a legacy, a far-sighted vision of mission "*to the ends of the earth*"!

### **Educational Theater:** *The Importance of Responsible Antibiotic Use*

On October 24, Dispensario San José held an educational theater performance aimed at children, focusing on a critical health topic: the responsible use of antibiotics. Organized by Dr. César Anleu, a pediatrician, and Guiselle De León, an educator from the educational program, the event aimed to raise awareness among families about the risks of improper antibiotic use, especially for children.

The play opened with the story of Anita, a young girl suffering from a stomachache caused by a virus. Her

concerned father, eager to relieve her discomfort, contacts Dr. Wise to ask if antibiotics would help. Dr. Wise then explains that antibiotics are only effective against bacterial infections, not viruses, and that using them unnecessarily could actually make germs stronger.



The storyline continued with a creative, humorous portrayal of how viruses and bacteria "mocked" the antibiotics, highlighting how antibiotics don't work

against viral infections and can actually strengthen bacteria if misused. In a key scene, Dr. Wise arrives to examine Anita and reassures her father that antibiotics aren't needed in this case. Instead, he recommends rest and certain home care measures, explaining the specific role of antibiotics to the family.

In the final scene, Anita recovers and cheerfully bids farewell to the virus, affirming that Dr. Wise's advice was indeed correct. The play concluded with a powerful message from the children in unison: "Antibiotics should be used responsibly and only under a doctor's guidance."

To reinforce this message, Dr. César Anleu gave a brief talk to the parents in attendance, encouraging them to avoid self-medicating and to understand the importance of using antibiotics only when absolutely necessary. This event was not only educational but also engaged both children and adults, emphasizing the family's role in safe medication practices. ~ *submitted by Vannesa, Comunicacion Cabrini*

The program began in the chapel where our clients spoke about the meaning of Día de los Muertos. The residents were then led out to the lobby behind one of the clients who

was carrying the Book of the Dead. The names of deceased family, friends, residents, etc. are written in this book. The way to the lobby was lit with candles inside luminaria bags.

The clients spoke about the altar and the meaning of the different items. There were pictures and names of their loved ones on the altar. Special flowers, fruits, bread,



sugar skulls and candles were also placed on the altar.

Through tears, many described how being able to share in this moment helped them as they prayed and remembered their loved ones. Everyone present was invited to add the names and pictures of their loved ones to the altar where they would be remembered in prayer.
